## Mentorship Programme



### About the network

The [Network of Women](#) for the World Telecommunication Development Conference (NoW4WTDC) initiative aims at building capacity for the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC) process and encouraging active participation of women as delegates, chairs, vice-chairs, among other leadership roles in the conference structures and ITU-D in general. The mentorship programme is open to women participating in all events in preparation for WTDC.



### Matching process

- Collection of preferences via an online survey available on [NOW4WTDC](#) website;
- Match mentors and mentees in pairs;
- Mentor and Mentee share goals, experiences, and aspirations;
- Mentor guides the mentee.



### Tips for mentorship

- Begin with a one-to-one ice-break meeting at the earliest opportunity;
- Build trust and mutual respect by sharing experiences;
- Share goals, mutual expectations and understanding of the mentorship programme;
- Plan next steps in the mentorship process;
- Meet regularly at mutually agreeable intervals;
- Begin your mentorship programme at the earliest opportunity.



### Target participants

Any female delegate willing to be a mentor or mentee in the mentorship programme.



### Reminders

To Mentees:

- Take the initiative to meet your mentor;
- Take advantage of the mentorship at the earliest opportunity.

To Mentors:

- Create inspiration for your mentee;
- Help navigate the mentee to have a wonderful mentorship experience.



### Basic principles

**Informal format:** This mentorship programme is an informal interpersonal mentorship across ITU-D members. It is independent from any other mentorship within or outside ITU.

**Trust and Confidentiality:** All exchanges between participants in this mentorship programme are confidential. The relationship is based on trust and mutual respect.

**Time:** The duration of mentorship arrangement should be agreed between mentor and mentee.



### Objectives

The mentorship programme aims to:

- Foster interdisciplinary cooperation and teamwork in preparation for the [WTDC](#);
- Expand the professional networks;
- Facilitate sharing of knowledge and skills;
- Encourage learning from experiences.
