Information on precise requirements for obtaining a visa may be requested at the embassy or consulate in your country.

Persons requiring a visa to enter Peru should apply to Ms Lezly Morales (lmorales@inictel-uni.edu.pe) for a personalized letter of invitation which will be sent to the applicant by e-mail. The letter should then be submitted to the Peruvian embassy or consulate in the applicant's country in order to obtain the visa.

Peru does not require any type of vaccination certificate, although anyone intending to travel to areas outside Lima, including the rain forest region, will need to be vaccinated against yellow fever at least ten days in advance of travel.

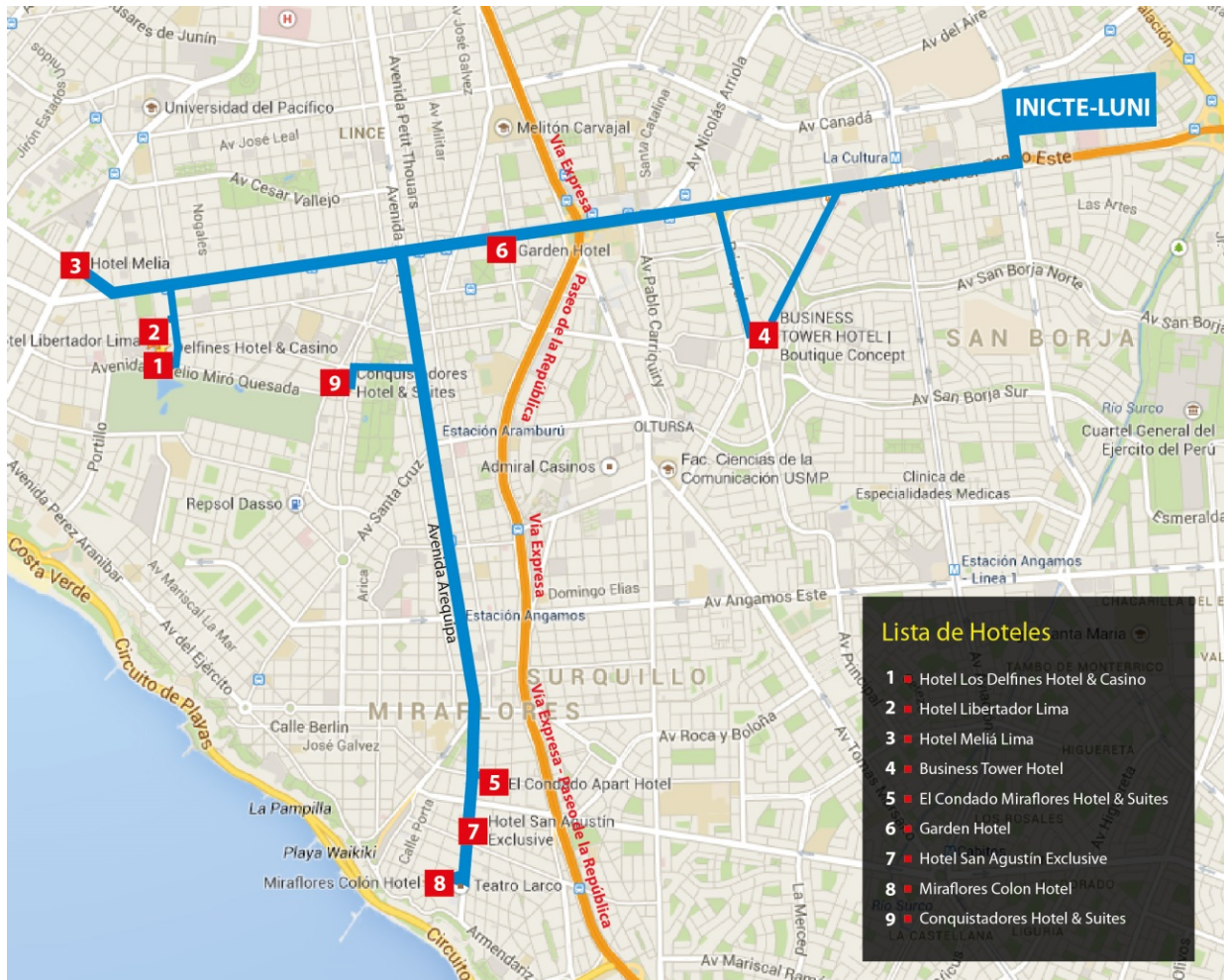

5. FLIGHTS AND TRANSPORT

Jorge Chávez International Airport is located 30 minutes from the city and is used for international arrivals and departures. Delegates have a number of options for getting from the airport to their hotels in Lima.

Private chauffeur-driven cars and taxis: The airport has many taxi companies and private car hire companies, which can be found at the arriving passengers' exit from the disembarkation area.

Approximate fare for the transfer from the airport is:

Airport - San Isidro: S/. 60.00 (US\$ 25.00)

Airport - San Borja: S/.90.00 (US\$ 35.00)

B. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Peru – Diverse, ancient, and natural

Peru is the country of Inca's culture. The Incas were an amazing civilization that dominated the geography of the country and who learned how to live harmonically with the rivers, the son, the sierra, the jungle, the sea, the climate of the coast, the mountains and its cold and dry climate of the Andes. They got used to the surroundings, and they survived thank to the products provided by the Pachamama.

One part of this ancient culture and society still remains in each town conserved in the habits of the folks. Visiting Peru is travelling to the past and meeting the exciting live stile of the ancient cultures as is the case of the Incas, the Chancas, the Chachapoyas, the Mochicas, and the Wari. It is possible to appreciate their great pieces of art, the architecture, the festivities, the roots of their society, and the strength or their folk.

Other very important part of the history is the mixture of the ancient cultures with the Hispanic culture. Peru has an influence from cultures of occident, orient, and Africa.

In Peru is possible to visit deserts, mountains, forests, the Amazon, the sea, exotic landscapes, flora, fauna, and a very rich culture.

2. The city of Lima

LIMA World Heritage Site by UNESCO

To the north is located Caral, the most ancient culture of America, to the south is located the Archaeological Site Pachacamac. The history of Lima goes further than the Hispanic domination. The establishment of the Kingdom converted Lima to the political and

administrative center of South America. During this period, many churches and many houses were built. Nowadays all those houses constitute the center of the city and its preservation allowed Lima to become World Heritage.

The museums with great pieces of art, the archaeological sites, the beaches, the valleys, the flora, the fauna, the night life, the adrenaline, the sports of adventure, and the great gastronomy provides a unique personality to the city that makes each visit a great experience.

Location: Lima is located at the west-center of Peru, at the edge of the Pacific Ocean.

Extension: The metropolitan Lima has 2.817 Km².

3. Time zone

Local time throughout Peru is GMT (UTC) –5.

4. Language

The official language is Spanish.

5. Mains electricity

The mains voltage in Peru is 220V / 60 Hz. Most 4 and 5 star hotels also have 110V outlets.

6. Climate

Average temperature in Lima in September will be between 13°C and 21 C (winter season with 90% humidity).

7. Currency and exchange rates

The national currency of Peru is the Nuevo Sol (\$/.). Coins of 10, 20 and 50 cents and 1, 2 and 5 Nuevo Sol are in circulation, as well as 10, 20, 50, 100 and 200 Nuevo Sol notes.



The exchange rate fluctuates freely according to market conditions. Information on the prevailing exchange rate is available at <http://www.sbs.gob.pe/app/stats/tc-cv.asp>.

Visitors are advised to exchange money through banks or currency exchanges. Local banks operate from Monday to Friday between 09.00 and 18.00.

Most commercial establishments accept credit cards (American Express, Diners Club, MasterCard and Visa).
